





Step into the shoes of the team that maintains one of the most historically significant areas of the Singapore Botanic Gardens—the Heritage Core. Follow the path of a horticulturist and learn how expert care is applied to landscapes shaped by over 160 years of botanical and cultural legacy.

Beginning at Tanglin Visitor Centre, this experience takes you through key landmarks including Holttum Hall, the iconic Bandstand, and Swan Lake. Discover how plant selection, pruning methods, and landscape presentation are tailored to meet the demands of maintaining a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The session concludes with a briefing on horticultural planning and challenges unique to heritage landscapes—giving you a practical, behind-the-scenes understanding of what it means to care for living history.

DNA Unlocked: A Plant-Based Discovery for Adults 19, 26 July, Saturdays | 10.00am – 12.00pm Ridley Hall @ Botany Centre

This interactive workshop offers an engaging introduction to key biological concepts, including the structure and function of DNA, plant genomes, and the role of nuclei. Participants will carry out plant cell staining and observe their samples under a microscope—gaining a direct view into the microscopic structures that underpin plant life.

The session also includes a guided tour of a working laboratory, where participants will learn how scientists at the Singapore Botanic Gardens study plant genomes to advance botanical research. The experience culminates in a hands-on DNA extraction activity using fruit and household materials, offering a tangible look at the genetic material shared by all living organisms.

Ideal for adults with a general interest in biology, this workshop provides meaningful insight into the science of life in an accessible, hands-on format.

DNA Unlocked: A Plant-Based Discovery for Young Explorers

20, 27 July, Sundays | 10.00am – 12.00pm Ridley Hall @ Botany Centre

This hands-on workshop offers an exciting introduction to the fascinating world of DNA—the building blocks of life. Participants will discover what DNA is, why it matters, and how it plays a vital role in shaping every living thing, from plants and animals to people.

The session features a guided DNA extraction activity using fruit and simple materials commonly found at home. Step by step, participants will get to see the normally invisible strands of genetic material appear before their eyes, sparking curiosity and wonder.

Along the way, they'll learn basic scientific concepts in a fun, accessible way—encouraging them to ask questions, think critically, and see science as something they can explore with their own hands. A perfect first step into the world of biology, this workshop promises both learning and play in equal measure.

Race Against Time - Science Behind a Botanic Garden Tour



Planting Memories – Singapore Botanic Gardens through the eyes of the Community






Botanical Art Worldwide 2025 Singapore Daily | 9am - 6pm* | Botanical Art Gallery [Gallop Extension]

In celebration of the theme of Crop Diversity and its significance in cultural and agricultural history, this exhibition is one of over 30 exhibitions happening simultaneously across the globe. It is co-organised by the Botanical Art Society (Singapore) and the Singapore Botanic Gardens (SBG) as part of the second Botanical Art Worldwide Project, in conjunction with the Worldwide Day of Botanical Art celebrated on May 18.

Members of the Botanical Art Society (Singapore) have submitted botanical artworks exploring Heritage Crops—traditional plant cultivars not used in modern, large-scale monocultural agriculture; Crop Wild Relatives—wild species that can enhance cultivated crops or are foraged wild plants; and Ancient Crops— plants cultivated for centuries in their original form. Each piece has been carefully selected by a panel of expert botanists and botanical artists based on scientific accuracy, artistic merit, technical mastery, and overall impact.

Roots of Knowledge: Celebrating 150 Years of the Singapore Botanic Gardens Library

The year 2025 marks the 150th anniversary of the Library at the Singapore Botanic Gardens, one of Southeast Asia's oldest and most significant botanical libraries.

This special exhibition features rare books and historical records that date as far back as 1531. These collections support the Gardens' long-standing work in plant research, conservation, education, and public outreach.

Through carefully curated displays in the Botanical Art Gallery, discover the evolution of botanical art and documentation, and learn how these invaluable materials contributed to the Singapore Botanic Gardens becoming the first and only tropical botanic garden on the UNESCO's World Heritage List.

Forest Discovery Centre @ OCBC Arboretum Daily | 9am – 6pm* | Forest Discovery Centre @ OCBC Arboretum [Gallop Extension]

The Forest Discovery Centre @ OCBC Arboretum showcases the forest ecosystems in Singapore and highlights the importance of conserving them through a series of interpretive and interactive displays. Visitors can enjoy a bird's eye view of Singapore's diverse forests and learn about the Gardens' historical contributions to their preservation through a photographic installation featuring forest trees found in various local habitats.

Ethnobotany and Diversity of Dipterocarps

25 Jan – 27 Sep 2025 | 9am – 6pm* | Level 2, Centre for Ethnobotany [Bukit Timah Gate]

Dipterocarps are a remarkable family of tropical hardwood trees known for their towering heights. These trees, found predominantly in Southeast Asia, are not only ecologically important but also serve as a traditional and economic resource. The family name Dipterocarpaceae derives from the Greek words "di" (two), "ptero" (wing), and "carpos" (fruit), referring to the distinctive two-winged fruits that many species develop. These fruits play a crucial role in seed dispersal, with some species relying on wind, while others are dispersed by gravity, water, or even animals like macaques and wild boars.

This exhibition invites you to explore the rich history, ecological importance, and versatile uses of dipterocarps. Join us to uncover the stories of these forest giants and their lasting impact on our environment and heritage.

The Seed Bank has an interpretive gallery that provides insights into its purpose and significance in plant conservation and research within Singapore and the region. Additionally, visitors can explore a seed dispersal garden, which showcases seed sculptures demonstrating various seed dispersal mechanisms.
